Meeting Minutes: June 20, 2022

The regular meeting of the LaGrange Town Council met at 6:00 pm, at the LaGrange Town Hall.
(Also available via Zoom)

Council Members Present: Raymond Hoover, Fred Romer, Carolyn Glick, Diane Cameron and Josh Shotzman,

Also present: Laurie Miller, Bill D Eberhard Jr (Zoom), and Charity Murphy

President Hoover opened the meeting at precisely 6:00 pm.

Member Romer motioned to approve the agenda with flexibility, Member Glick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Council Member Romer made a motion to approve the minutes from June 6, 2022, Member Glick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

CLERK:

- Presented the May Bank reconciliation reports for council review. Member Romer motioned to approve and sign the document, Member Glick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

WASTEWATER:

- Received one quote for lining the sanitary sewer line on Spring Street. Supt Helmuth does not believe this is the proper fix for this line. He recommends pipe bursting, noting that the cost will be approximately 1 ½ times the quote provided. (\$63950.00) Council discussed the issue, including moving Spring Street up in street repair priority. They asked Helmuth to get a quote on bursting.

WATER:

- Gave an update on the water treatment plant progress and the Union Street project
- Drinking fountain has been installed at the Splash pad. Will be working on the one at the Courthouse next.
- Installed two new service lines.

FIRE:

- Reported that Ladder Truck 14 was in an accident, it will need the repairs made and re-certified prior to listing it for sale.
- Requested the use of the Town Hall parking lot for a bike/car show as well as a dinner fundraiser. Will need a liability release form signed for the owners of vehicles being shown.

POLICE:

- Asked the council to approve Detective Nick Martin be approved to work with the Department of Homeland Security and the "Crimes against Children" Team. The town will be re-imbursed for the time worked by Martin by the DHS. Member Romer motioned to allow Martin to be on the ICAC team. Member Glick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

STREET:

- Gave a list of jobs they are working on and have completed.

PARK:

- Reminded the Attorney to complete the user agreement between the Town of LaGrange and Avail Portapotties.
- Discussed the need for a water resistant display for reserved signs for the pavilions.

TOWN MANAGER:

- Updated the council on the Hometown Heroes banner program. The group will use private poles for their banners as NIPSCO will not allow the program on their poles.
- Submitted a claim from API in the amount of \$402,106.50 for Union Street. Member Romer motioned to approve

the claim, Member Glick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

ATTORNEY:

- Discussed the Public Hearing regarding Food Truck sales. A hearing was sent for July 18, 2022.


OPEN DISCUSSION:
